Start Slow and Be Patient

- Let Them Approach You: Avoid forcing contact. Let your dog come to you when they're ready.
- Short, Positive Interactions: Keep sessions brief, upbeat, and pressure-free.
- **Reward Bravery:** Anytime they try something new or face a fear, reward with treats, praise, or play!

Create a Safe Space

- Quiet Areas: Set up a quiet, cozy spot where your dog can retreat and feel safe.
- **Predictable Routine:** Stick to a simple routine for feeding, walks, and playtime to build trust and reduce anxiety.

Confidence Building Activities

- **Gentle Socialization:** Carefully introduce new people, sounds, and experiences at their pace.
- **Training Games:** Fun, reward-based games like "touch" or "find the treat" build both skills and confidence.
- **Enrichment:** Puzzle toys, sniff walks, and interactive play stimulate their mind and boost self-esteem.

When to Seek Help

- **Professional Support:** If your dog's fear is severe, consult a positive-reinforcement trainer or behaviorist.
- **Medical Concerns:** Sometimes fearfulness can have a medical root. Talk to your vet if you notice unusual behavior.
