## Before Bringing Your Dog Home

- **Prepare a Safe Space:** Set up a quiet area with a bed, water, and food bowls to help them feel secure.
- **Gather Supplies:** Have food, toys, a collar, and a leash ready before they arrive.
- **Dog-Proof Your Home:** Remove hazards like electrical cords, toxic plants, and small objects they might chew.

## The First Few Days

- **Give Them Time to Decompress:** Let them explore their new environment at their own pace.
- **Establish a Routine:** Consistent feeding, walking, and sleeping schedules will help them feel secure.
- **Limit Visitors:** Too many new people at once can be overwhelming—introduce them gradually.

## Building Trust and Bonding

- **Use Positive Reinforcement:** Reward good behavior with treats and praise.
- **Avoid Overwhelming Situations:** Keep introductions to other pets and people slow and controlled.
- **Be Patient:** Some dogs take weeks or even months to fully adjust—give them time to settle in.

## Common Adjustment Challenges

- **Hiding or Shyness:** Give them space and allow them to come to you when they're ready.
- **House Training Issues:** Stick to a schedule and reinforce good potty habits with rewards.
- **Separation Anxiety:** Practice leaving them alone for short periods and gradually increase the time.

## When to Seek Professional Help

- If your dog shows extreme fear, aggression, or anxiety that doesn't improve over time.
- If they refuse to eat or drink for an extended period.
- If they exhibit destructive behaviors that worsen despite training.

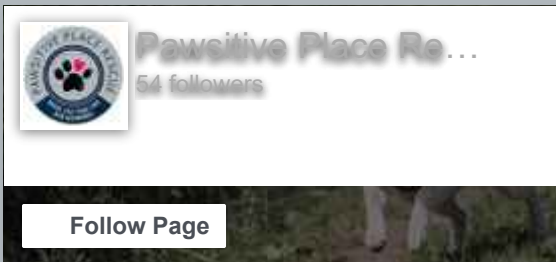
