## Why Breed Traits Matter

- Every breed was developed with a purpose—herding, guarding, companionship, and more.
- Knowing their instincts and energy levels helps prevent behavior issues.
- Mixed breeds can inherit traits from both sides—watch for patterns and preferences.

## Common Breed Groups

- **Working Breeds:** Intelligent, strong, and driven (e.g., Huskies, Boxers, Dobermans).
- **Herding Breeds:** Agile and high-energy, thrive with tasks (e.g., Border Collies, Aussies).
- **Toy Breeds:** Perfect for small spaces, love attention (e.g., Chihuahuas, Pomeranians).
- **Hounds:** Natural hunters with strong scent drive (e.g., Beagles, Bassets).
- **Terriers:** Feisty and alert, love a challenge (e.g., Jack Russells, Schnauzers).
- **Sporting Breeds:** Energetic and playful, love the outdoors (e.g., Labs, Golden Retrievers).

## Matching Breeds to Homes

- Apartment? Choose a lower-energy breed or one that enjoys calm environments.
- Kids in the house? Go with friendly, patient breeds like Labs or Golden Retrievers.
- Busy lifestyle? Adopt a senior or low-maintenance breed.
- Looking for a jogging buddy? Consider an active breed like a Vizsla or Aussie.

## Rescues & Mixed Breeds

- Mixed breeds are full of personality and often more adaptable.
- Ask shelter staff about temperament and known traits.
- Remember—every dog is an individual, regardless of breed!

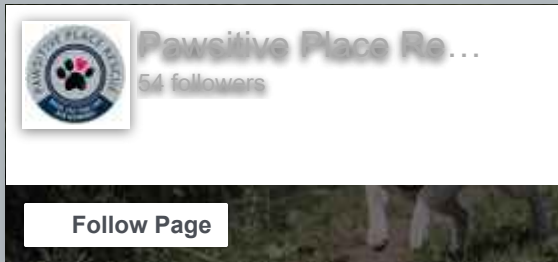
